
Fast and Pray

Letter from Compassion

About Rosette, Our Sponsored Child

"Thank you for your enquiry regarding the health situation of Ntegyerize Rosette. I have made enquiries with our office in Uganda, who have confirmed that Rosette is very seriously unwell and have provided us with some more information.

The Ugandan office has informed us that Rosette is extremely unwell and that she is suffering from HIV. She also has had symptoms of epilepsy.

Rosette's illness is life threatening. However, she has been improving in the last few weeks. In the recent past she was unable to talk, stand or feed herself but recently she has been able to wash her clothes, has tried to feed herself, can crawl and reach out for something. The project is praying that she will improve.

Rosette is currently at home. Her mother collects medicine for her from Kisiizi hospital, and she is receiving regular treatment. Rosette is too ill to be able to attend the project. However, the staff from the project visits and spend time with her, supporting and counselling her,
