


Cornerstone House Centre is an established and respected social enterprise charity which provides various community services and access to facilities for groups and citizens in Cumbernauld.

Cumbernauld Community Health Information Hub is an innovative initiative established to facilitate information about and access to health and social care providers for the citizens of Cumbernauld, Kilsyth and surrounding villages.

The Health Information Hub operates on a daily basis from Cornerstone House Centre in Cumbernauld. It also incorporates free monthly Community Awareness Raising Events (drop-in) at which various community health service providers and professionals are on hand to advise, inform and liaise informally with members of the public.
